All seams are sewn using a ¼" seam allowance



## **Block Assembly:**

1. Pair light & dark tiles as follows: (NOTE: Set aside one extra Fabric A & Fabric H tile.)


Fabric A & Fabric E Fabric B & Fabric F Fabric C & Fabric G Fabric D & Fabric H 2. Layer each pair right sides together and pin. Draw two diagonal lines on the lighter fabric.




3. Sew a ¼" from each side of both diagonal lines.



4. Then cut a horizontal line, a vertical line, and on both drawn diagonal lines as shown.



- 5. Open and press each HST to the dark fabric to make 8 HST Units. Trim HST Units to 4 ½" square.
- 6. Repeat these steps for all tile pairs to make 40 of each A-E, B-F, C-G & D-H HST Units.






# **Quilt Top Assembly:**

- 8. Sew units together into rows. Then sew rows together to complete the block. Repeat to make 20 blocks.
- 9. Arrange blocks in five rows of four blocks each, turning blocks as shown.
- 10. Sew blocks together into rows. Then sew rows together.



- 11. Join the  $6-1\,\%$ " x WOF Fabric G inner border strips end to end. From the long strip, cut 2 60 %" side border strips and sew to the sides of the quilt top. Then cut 2 50 %" top & bottom border strips and sew to the top & bottom of the quilt top.
- 12. Layer the remaining Fabric A and Fabric H tiles with right sides together and pin.
- 13. Stitch around the outer edge of the square using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam as shown.



- 14. Cut the square twice on the diagonal as shown to yield HST Cornerstone Units.
- 15. Open and press carefully to the dark side, being careful not to stretch bias edges.
- 16. Join the  $6 6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric C outer border strips end to end. From the long strip, cut  $2 62 \frac{1}{2}$ " side border strips and sew to the sides of the quilt top.
- 17. From the remaining outer border strip, cut 2-50 %" top & bottom border strips. Sew an HST Cornerstone Unit to each end of the top & bottom border strips, turning the units as shown in the finished quilt image. Then sew these strips to the top & bottom of the quilt top.
- 18. Join the Fabric G binding strips using diagonal seams. Fold in half wrong sides together along the length of the strip and press.
- 19. Layer quilt top with batting and prepared backing. Quilt as desired.
- 20. Bind quilt using your favorite method.

#### **Quilt Top Assembly:**

- 1. Arrange blocks into 10 rows of 8, alternating between light square/dark sashing blocks and dark square/light sashing blocks.
- 2. Sew blocks together into rows, pressing seams to the left on row 1, to the right on row 2, etc. so that seams will nest when the rows are sewn together. Sew rows together.
- 3. Join the Fabric C Inner Border strips end to end. Cut  $2 1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 50  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and sew to each side of the quilt top. Then cut  $2 1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 42  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and sew to top and bottom of the quilt top.
- 4. From the Fabric C 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, cut 4 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (cornerstones).
- 5. Join the Fabric D Outer Border strips end to end. Cut  $2 5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 52  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and sew to each side of the quilt top.
- 6. Then cut  $2 5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 42  $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. Sew a Fabric C cornerstone to each end of these strips. Then sew the strips to the top and bottom of the quilt top.

#### **Finishing the Quilt:**

- 1. Join the Fabric C binding strips using diagonal seams. Fold in half wrong sides together along the length of the strip and press.
- 2. Layer quilt top with batting and prepared backing. Quilt as desired.
- 3. Bind quilt using your favorite method.
