Fabric Requirements:

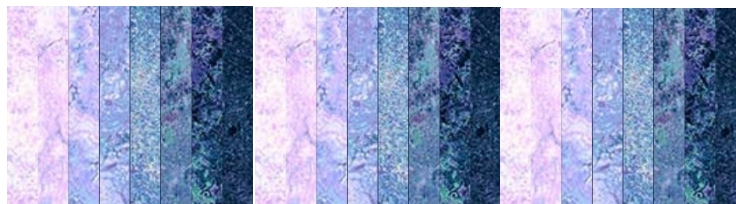
Twilight	Onyx	Yardage	Cutting Instructions
SSTONE40-66	SSTONE40-99	1 Strip Pack (40 – 2 ½" x WOF strips)	See Instructions below.
Fabric A 39306-94  (Background & Border)	Fabric A 39382-12  (Background & Border)	1 3/4 yds	Cut 4 – 5 ¼" x WOF strips ➤ Sub-cut 28 – 5 ¼" squares From these, ○ Cut 24 squares <u>once</u> on the diagonal (large triangles) ○ Cut 4 squares <u>twice</u> on the diagonal (small triangles) Cut 1 – 6 ½" x WOF strip Cut 7 – 4 ½" x WOF strips
Fabric B 39300-67 (Binding) 	Fabric B 39300-99 	5/8 yd	Cut 7 – 2 ½" x WOF strips
Crosswise Backing 39302-67 	Crosswise Backing 39302-99 	4 yds	Cut fabric in half along length of fabric. Join the 2 – 72" x WOF pieces along the selvage edges.

Piecing Instructions – Row 1:

1. Lay out strips from lightest to darkest in four sets of eight each. You will have eight strips left over (two each of lightest & darkest). Set those strips aside.
2. Sew each set of eight strips together, pressing to the darker side.
3. Sub-cut each strip set into 4 – 9 ½" segments.



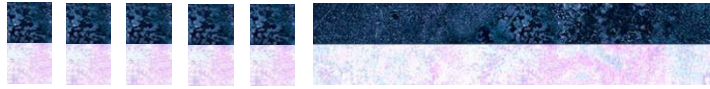
4. Turn three segments sideways and sew together as shown to complete Row 1.



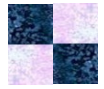
5. Repeat to make a total of five Row 1's. (You will have one strip set left over.)

Piecing Instructions – Row 2:

1. Pair the remaining light & dark strips. With right sides together, sew four strip sets and cut into 56 – 2 ½” segments as shown.



2. Pair the segments in two's, turning one segment. Sew together to complete one 4-Patch Unit as shown. Repeat to make a total of 28 4-Patch Units.



3. Take 40 of the Fabric A large triangles (5 ¼” squares cut once on the diagonal) and sew one to each opposite side of 20 - 4-Patch Units as shown.



4. Sew together in sets of five for each row.

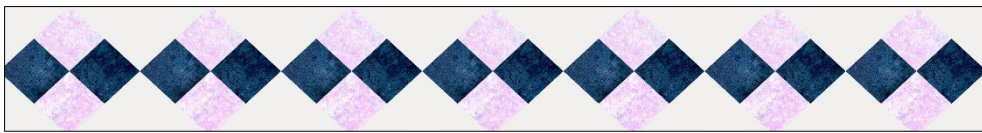
5. Sew one of the remaining large triangles to one side of each of the remaining 8 – 4-Patch Units, and two small triangles (5 ¼” squares cut twice on the diagonal) to two opposite sides as shown. Sew an End Unit to each end of the four Row 2's.

6. An extra rectangle of Background A is to be added to one end of each Row 2 so that it measures the same length as Row 1. To do this, measure your Row 1's (each should measure 48 ½”). Then measure your Row 2's (each should measure about 42 ½”). From the Fabric A 6 ½” x WOF strip, cut 4 – 6 ½” x 6” rectangles (or whatever length is needed to make Row 2 the same width as Row 1). Join a rectangle to one end of each row to make a total of four Row 2's.



7. Join rows together, alternating Row 1 & Row 2, and turning every other Row 1 & Row 2. Refer to the finished quilt image for placement.
8. Join the 7 – 4 ½” x WOF Fabric A strips end to end. Measure the length of your quilt top and cut two side border strips to the appropriate size (approximately 69 ½” each). Sew a border to each side.
9. Then measure the width of your quilt top and cut top & bottom border strips to the appropriate size (approximately 56 ½”). Add top & bottom borders in the same manner.
10. Join the seven Fabric B binding strips using diagonal seams. Fold in half, wrong sides together, along the length of the strip and press.
11. Layer quilt top with batting & backing. Quilt as desired. Then bind using your favorite method.
