Turn nine 5" chips from Northcott's Stonehenge Surfaces collection into a quick topper or wall quilt with the addition of some background.

## **Finished size:** 19½" x 26" Skill level: Confident beginner

Number of blocks and finished size: (18) 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" finished blocks (5" edge-to-edge)

**Cutting Instructions**: wof = width of fabric  $\square$  = cut once diagonally  $\square$  = cut twice diagonally Label pieces as indicated.

Fabric	Yardage	Cutting		
A -Stonehenge	1 pack of at least	♦ Select (9) 5" squares; cut each square in half to make (2) 2½" x 5" pieces (A)		
Surfaces chips	(9) 5" squares	from each (total 18 pieces).		
<b>B</b> – background	½yd	♦ Cut 1 strip 7 <sup>5</sup> / <sub>4</sub> " x wof; cut into (3) 7 <sup>5</sup> / <sub>4</sub> " squares ⊠ ( <b>B2</b> ) and (2) 4 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>4</sub> " squares ⊠ ( <b>B3</b> ).		
		◊ Cut 4 strips 1¾" x wof; cut into (36) 5" x 1¾" pieces ( <b>B1</b> ) (use scraps).		
<b>C</b> – binding	¼yd	♦ Cut 3 strips 2" x wof; join end-to-end and press in half for binding.		

General Piecing: All seams are ¼". Press toward darker fabric unless indicated.

Tip for aligning patches for sewing: When you have 2 patches to be sewn together and they are sloped at opposite angles,


they are correctly aligned when they meet at the ¼" seam line as shown at right. When you have 2 patches to be sewn together and only one is sloped at an angle, they are correctly aligned when they meet  $\frac{3}{2}$  from the edge as shown at far right. However, sew them together with a  $\frac{3}{2}$ seam.

#### Piecing:

Backing

1. Sew a B1 piece onto opposite long edges of each A piece; press seams toward A. Make a total of 18 blocks. Blocks should measure 5" edge-to-edge.











2. Using the layout diagram as a guide, arrange the blocks on-point in 4 rows of 3, having the A piece in each block oriented (sloping) in the same direction.

3. Insert the remaining 6 blocks in the spaces between the blocks, orienting them in the opposite direction. Also insert the B2 triangles at outer edges and the B3 triangles at outer corners.

4. Sew into diagonal rows, pressing seams toward B1 pieces. Sew rows together, nesting seams at intersections and pressing seams in direction of arrows.

**Tip:** Unpick the stitches in the cross-seam seam allowance to spin the center seam and reduce the bulk.

### Finishing:

Layer the prepared backing, a 25" x 32" piece of batting and the quilt top. Baste and

quilt as desired. Trim edges even with quilt top. Sew the prepared binding to the edges with a ¼" seam, turn and stitch in place. Enjoy your new quilt!
